2019 Municipal Elections Early Voting Summary

October 8, 2019 Municipal Election

The municipalities of Raleigh and Cary will hold municipal elections on October 8, 2019. If no candidate in a given race receives a majority of the votes, a runoff election will be held on November 5, 2019. All early voting facilities in Raleigh and Cary in addition to the Board of Elections office.

The City of Durham may have a nonpartisan primary election on October 8, 2019. Voters who reside in the Wake County portion of the City of Durham may vote at any available early voting facility open during the October 8, 2019 Municipal Election.

November 5, 2019 Municipal Election

The remaining municipalities in Wake County will hold municipal elections on November 5, 2019. Early voting facilities in Apex and Garner will be open in addition to the Board of Elections office.

If Cary requires a runoff election, the early voting facility located in Cary will be open in addition to Garner, Apex and the Board of Elections office.

If a Raleigh citywide race (Mayor or City Council At-Large) requires a runoff election, all early voting facilities located in Raleigh will be open in addition to Garner, Apex and the Board of Elections office.

If a Raleigh district race (City Council District A, B, C, D, E) requires a runoff election, only the early voting facility located in the affected district(s) will be open in addition to Garner, Apex and the Board of Elections office.

If both Raleigh and Cary require a runoff election, the affected early voting facilities in Raleigh will be open in addition to Cary, Garner, Apex and the Board of Elections office.
