Requirements for Certain First-time Voters

When you first register to vote in the state, you are asked to provide an NCDMV/driver's license number or the last four digits of a Social Security Number. For voters who do not provide this information, or if that information can't be verified, **the voter must show one of the forms of ID listed below when they first vote.** This is required by a federal law, the Help America Vote Act (HAVA). This is different from the photo ID requirement, which applies to all voters in every election.

Current and Valid Photo Identification

- NC driver license or ID card issued by North Carolina or another state
- U.S. Military ID
- U.S. Passport
- Other government-issued photo ID
- Student photo ID
- Certified Naturalization Document

Current Name & Address Document

- Utility bill: telephone; mobile phone; electric or gas; cable television; water or sewage; internet
- Bank statement or bank-issued credit card statement
- Paycheck or paycheck stub from an employer or a W-2 statement
- Government paycheck, invoice, letter, or any other document from a local, state, or U.S. government agency
- Other Government Documents: Property tax bill; License to hunt, fish, own a gun; Automotive registration; Public housing or Social Service Agency document; Birth certificate

What is a Current Document?

To be "current," the document must be unexpired, if it has an expiration date. If the document does not have an expiration date, the issuance date must be within six months of the date it is presented to the election official. If a document does not have an issuance date or expiration date, there must be other time-based indicators on the document showing that it is current.

If you cannot show acceptable ID when you vote, you may still vote by casting a provisional ballot. You will then need to send or bring one of the forms of ID below to your county board of elections. It must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on the ninth day after election day in order for your ballot to count.
